

FARM PRODUCE

RULES

1. Classes shall be open to all competitors, space permitting, with priority given to residents of Brome, Missisquoi and Shefford Counties.
2. **All entry forms**, including applicable fees, must be in the office of the secretary by **August 10th, before 8:00 p.m.** Entries received after this date will not be accepted and the post mark will no longer be taken into consideration. .
3. A **\$25 exhibitor's fee** must accompany entry form.
4. Exhibits will be received Thursday before fair from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Judging Friday at 9:00 a.m.
5. Committee members only will be permitted in the judging area.
6. **Section 910:** Every exhibitor must be a beekeeper.
7. **Section 920:** Every exhibitor must be a maple producer. Syrup to be used from current year. The exhibits presented should not display any trade mark of the exhibitor.

910 Honey

Prizes for the following classes
